Everyone who volunteers and submits slides gets +10 points (or 1% extra credit grade) on their term paper.

If a student is selected to present, they will get +10 to +30 points (1-3% extra credit grade) on the term paper.

Each presentation will be strictly timed and span 5 minutes. There could be an additional 2 minutes of Q&A.

Presentations will be due via email to the section TA, head TA, and the professor by 11:59pm Eastern Time on April 20.
